LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Hello all -

It has been an incredibly exciting and productive year so far, with the Board, and all of our Committees and Task Forces hard at work. With a little over half the year past - it's a great time to check in on our progress:



- new Committees were created for Diversity, Scholarship and Expansion
- the Diversity Committee, and a dedicated Task Force has produced the <u>ACTO Stand on Diversity</u>, <u>Inclusion and Belonging</u>, to create a strong position and statement within the coaching profession
- the new Scholarship Committee has created an award process and Scholarships that will be available for Member schools to award to students
- the Education Committee created a robust lineup of speakers and content, featuring a number of speakers in the arena of power, privilege and difference and continues to support schools with integration of the PCC Markers
- the Membership Committee has converted us to a rolling membership format
- the Expansion Committee has increased awareness of ACTO in Turkey, Asia (India, Thailand, Singapore), Italy & South Africa
- the Ethics Task Force has nearly completed a review of the new Code of Ethics through the lens of Diversity & Inclusion and is at work on an Ethics training for our member schools
- the Trainer Competency Task Force is hard at work refining the competencies and creating an Ethics training course
- the Conference presenter proposal process has been transformed to include waiving of entry fees for presenters and transportation grants

Excitement is building as we put together all the details for our <u>Conference</u> in June! We have confirmed two very compelling keynote speakers... one announced below - and one to be released soon!

Another initiative of the Diversity Committee, brings with it an invitation for our members:

Over the next 6-8 weeks, ACTO Board Members are embarking together on a facilitated, reflective process designed to create awareness about our own knowledge, blind spots and biases when it comes to issues of cultural identity, difference, power and privilege. We will be providing feedback on the process, and intend to refine it before we then roll it out to Committee members for a second round of assessment and refinement.

If all goes well, the goal will be to make this process available to ACTO Members who are interested in doing their own self-awareness work in this regard. Watch for an invitation for members of your organization or faculty to participate in the coming months.

A lot of very exciting initiatives underway. I invite you to read our President Elect's note below about the value of volunteering - and consider jumping in to be a part of it all. I am writing to see if you would be interested in taking on a "low bono" coaching client as part of a project I am working on with the non-profit organization: Community Family Life Services.

In a nutshell, the project will support women who have been victims of domestic violence, homelessness and/or who have been previously incarcerated in developing skills and competency in Public Speaking.

I have been asked to recruit coaches who will be willing to provide limited coaching support for the training provided to the women accepted into the program.

Basic details are as follows:

Length of Engagement: 5 sessions - 1 prior to the training; 2 during the 4-week training period; 1 following the training period and a final session designed to help the client develop a "self-coaching" strategy moving forward. <u>All coaching will be conducted virtually.</u>

- Coaching Goals Clarification Session and Getting Connected -Mid-March;
- Coaching Session 1 session in late March;
- Coaching Session 2 in mid-April;
- Coaching Session 3 in late April: and
- Coaching Session 4 by mid-May to close out, support upcoming Speaking Engagement and develop a high-level strategy for continued individual and professional development.

Fee: The flat rate for this engagement is \$500

These quarterly sessions focus on shared learnings and best practices for getting the PCC Markers integrated into coach training programs, including staff training, curriculum updates, mentoring and assessing. Specific discussions on the individual Markers is not in the scope of these sessions.

Our last session explored best practices for getting your staff trained in the PCC Markers. Carrie Abner, ICF Director of Credentialing and Accreditation, joined us to provide up-to-date information on ICF strategies and processes for getting program staff trained on the Markers.

The next session brainstorms ways to continue the path to assessor alignment after PCC Marker training. What are coaching training organizations internally doing to support learning and assessing alignment? Your host, Teresa Pool, will facilitate the dialogue.

Topic: Coaching from Privilege This forum is FREE for members. Members must login to access the Member Registration link

We are a profession whose competencies are grounded in creating trust and intimacy. Nonetheless, even with the best of intentions, psychological chains can bind us to our myths, prevent us from active listening, and compromise our coaching presence. When establishing coaching agreements, asking powerful questions or goal setting; lack of awareness of classism, socio-economic status or other barriers can impact our ability to serve our client effectively.

Coaching from a position of privilege is not only elitist, it can be counterproductive to the profession of coaching. Unconscious bias and the impact it can have on clients is often grounded in myths associated with privilege. Unrecognized in coaching certification programs, implicit social biases can be one byproduct with unintended consequences. In short: Members from privileged groups are often unaware of and/or choose to put on blinders to the experiences of members from other groups.

Coaching from a position of privilege may marginalize, minimize and ignore the various LENS (Listen & Learn, Examine, Name and Summarize) occurring during the coach-client interaction. In some instances, coaches are looking through the LENS of centuries of socialized behavior (e.g. sex-role socialization, ethnocentrism, homophobia etc.) while building alliances with affinity groups grounded in privileges.

In this session, participants will expand on theories of coaching presence and build awareness about privilege by looking through cultural LENS related to the socialization process. Themes related to privilege, unconscious biases, intent vs impact, and cross-cultural communication will be covered in an interactive webinar format.
